Dear Parents & Carers,

It has seemed a long time since our Ofsted inspection which took place on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> June, but we have now received the final report.

We were really pleased with the inspection team; they were very thorough, fair, and listened to what pupils, staff, governors and indeed, parents had to say about the school. We all felt that they understood the journey of the school since the previous inspection and the trajectory that we are currently on.

The report covers the five following areas:

Quality of Education – this refers to the school's curriculum, the quality of teaching, the teaching of phonics and how pupils with additional needs are catered for.

The Quality of education at George Mitchell was judged to be 'Good'

Behaviour and attitudes – this refers to children's behaviour around the school, whether they feel safe and what their attitudes to learning are like.

Behaviour and attitudes at George Mitchell was judged to be 'Good'

Personal development – this refers to a variety of things around how the children see themselves and other people in the world and how well the school actively prepares them for the next stage of their education.

Leadership and management - this is a wide-ranging section taking in how the school is lead and managed at all levels, both from Headteacher/Governor level to individual subjects and curriculum leaders.

**Early Years provision** – this refers specifically to our Reception and Nursery provision. Early years provision at George Mitchell was judged to be 'Good'

The overall effectiveness judgement for the school was Good.
